The workshop "Islamic Feminism: Exploring Boundaries and Embracing Possibilities" is organized by Dr. Mansooreh Khalilizand, University of Freiburg, Prof. Dr. Kata Moser, University of Gottingen, and Prof. Dr. Abbas Poya, FAU Erlangen-Nürnberg. The workshop explores Islamic feminism as one of the most discussed intellectual movements in the Islamic world, examining its diversity and reflecting on its boundaries and theoretical potential for further development.
